



Emergency Water Conservation Regulation

Important Notice to all Trinidad Water Customers

Wednesdays and Saturdays are watering days for Trinidad Water Customers

The City Council has declared a drought emergency and placed restrictions on outdoor watering in response to State requirements. Please see the specific regulations below. These restrictions apply to all Trinidad water customers, whether you live inside or outside of the City limits. The Statewide mandatory conservation measures are targeting a 25% reduction of water use throughout California.

New Trinidad Water Use Restrictions – For All Water Customers

1. Outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable (City) water is limited to no more than 2 days per week on Wednesdays and Saturdays;
2. No watering outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes excess runoff;
3. No letting the water run while washing a motor vehicle (use a shutoff nozzle);
4. No using potable water to wash driveways and sidewalks;
5. No using potable water for a decorative fountain or other feature unless the water is recirculated;

Violations of these conservation measures are enforceable and may be punishable by a fine of up to \$500 per day.

New Prohibitions Affecting Commercial Businesses

1. Restaurants and other food service establishments can only serve water to customers on request; and
2. Operators of hotels and motels must provide guests with the option of choosing not to have towels and linens laundered daily and prominently display notice of this option.
