




## **Public Meeting Notice ASBS Stormwater Improvement Project**

**Wednesday, December 4 from 6:30 – 8:30 p. m.**

**Trinidad Town Hall, 409 Trinity St. in Trinidad**

Trinidad and Westhaven residents and the general public can learn about the City's Area of Special Biological Significance (ASBS) Stormwater Improvement project to modernize the City stormwater system. Incorporation of "green infrastructure" to capture, treat, and infiltrate stormwater runoff will reduce pollutants entering Trinidad Bay. Improvements consist of underground infiltration basins, 'bioswales', rain gardens and permeable pavers.



The project is generally located within City rights-of-way west of Highway 101 in Trinidad, east of Underwood Dr., and north of Edwards St. with improvements on Main, Trinity, Ocean, View, East, West Parker and Underwood. The Project is funded by a \$2.5 million grant from the State Water Resources Control Board to improve and protect the water quality in the Trinidad Bay ASBS. Trinidad Bay was designated an "Area of Special Biological Significance" or ASBS in 1974 by the State Water Resources Control Board. The ASBS designation is intended to provide special protections to marine life through the prohibition of discharges in these areas.
